## DUMPING ORDINANCE No. 14

An ordinance prohibiting dumping or depositing at that place known as Lewis Township Dump by anyone other than a legal resident of said LEWIS TOWNSHIP, UNION COUNTY, PA. with penalty for violations. PE IT ORDAINED BY THE SUPER-VISORS OF LEWIS TOWNSHIP, UNION COUNTY, PA.

It shall be unlawful for anyone other than a property owner, lessee, tenant, householder or resident of Lewis Township to deposit, throw, place, or cause to be deposited, throw or place, any ashes, rubbish, manure, garbage or refuse in that place known as Lewis Township Dump.

The word "garbage" in this ordinance means any offal, fish, fruit, vegetable or animal matters, liquid or otherwise, and any other organic substance subject to fermentation or decay, and house and storage sweepings and tin cans which contained animal or vegetable matter.

The word "ashes" in this ordinance means ashes from coal and wood and other organic substances such as may be used for filling purposes without becoming offensive.

The words "rubbish" and "refuse" meen tinware, wire, paper, rags, excelsior, straw, boxes, mattresses, old clothes, old shoes, leather scrap, rubber scrap, carpet, oil cloth, Christmas trees, prunings from vines, lawn trimmings, grass, bottles, broken glass, broken crockery, and all other inflammable and noninflammable waste materials which result from the ordinary conduct of housekeeping.

It shall be understood that all garbage, ashes, rubbish or refuse to be deposited in the Lewis Township Dump shall have originated within Lewis Township and not have been introduced from outside Lewis Township.

Any person, partnership or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction before a Justice of the Peace, be sentenced to pay for each violation a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, and in default of the payment of said fine shall be imprisoned in the Union County Jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

ENACTED into an Ordinance this 1st day of February 1964.
